

Individuals

Home Trust Company requires, at a minimum, either:

- One piece of primary identification and one piece of secondary as listed below; or
- Two separate pieces of primary identification as listed below.

Exclusions

RETAIL CREDIT PRODUCTS

- One piece of primary identification; or
- Two pieces of secondary identification (no credit card and debit card combinations).

SENIORS (67 & OVER)/MINORS (UNDER 18 YEARS)

- One piece of primary identification; or
- Two pieces of secondary identification (no credit card and debit card combinations).

MINORS (12 & UNDER)

Parents/guardians must be identified and provide the identification as required for individual clients.

ACCOUNTS AFFECTED BY A WILL/POWER OF ATTORNEY/TRUST

Executors, trustees and power of attorneys must provide identification as required for individual clients.

NON-CANADIANS AND NON-RESIDENTS

These individuals have a limited list of acceptable identification.¹

EMPLOYEE AND STUDENT IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Identification cards issued by employers to employees are not acceptable. Also, student identification cards are not acceptable.

Identification Document Quality Requirements

Documents must be:

- Original
- Valid (unexpired and signed, if appropriate)
- Legible

When copying documents, ensure both front and back are copied and retained, if applicable.

¹ For non-Canadians and non-residents, acceptable identification is limited to:

Primary ID – driver's license, passport or foreign national ID card (with photo)

Secondary ID – national ID card (without photo), the equivalent of SIN card or credit card⁵

² The BC Services Card can only be used as one piece of identification.

³ Quebec driver's license, health insurance card and OAS card may only be used if it is offered by the individual for identification.

⁴ Ontario, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island and Manitoba prohibit the use of health insurance cards as identification.

⁵ Credit cards are limited to major brands – Visa, MasterCard or American Express (pre-paid cards are excluded).
